This notice is to inform you that a public information meeting is scheduled to present the Long Ridge High Ridge Corridors study findings and final recommendations, and to receive any additional input from you. This will be the last opportunity for you to officially provide input in a public forum so that the plan fulfills the expectation and excitement of the new vision, and brings all of the participants together to further communicate and celebrate the final plan that acts as a catalyst for enhancing safety, mobility, aesthetics, and overall quality of life. You as an abutting property owner/resident, stakeholder member or neighborhood resident, who care about the future of our communities in developing & implementing measures specifically along both High Ridge Road and Long Ridge Road Corridors is requested to participate in this public outreach effort scheduled by the City of Stamford. By speaking up publicly for what you believe in, and by providing your support and assistance in finalizing the implementable measures developed based on all previous outreach efforts and stakeholder meetings for both corridors or by providing new measures, we will be able to achieve your vision for the City of Stamford.

The Long Ridge High Ridge Corridors study (LRHR Study) is a joint effort undertaken by the City of Stamford and in cooperation with its partners, the Southwest Regional Planning Agency (SWRPA) and the Connecticut Department of Transportation (CTDOT). The City of Stamford has retained Vanasse Hangen Brustlin, Inc., (VHB) who closely worked with the City, its partners, and a Technical Advisory Group (TAG) in preparing an Operational Improvements Plan for each corridor. Using an exciting, fully engaging stakeholder and public working process, the project team has created a

compelling corridor vision and improvement plans. Final document development of this two year study is one of the most important elements in establishing immediate and the future quality of life issues, and economic vitality within the City of Stamford. The study outcome has been to reach across all modes of travel, including automobile driving, walking, freight delivery, bicycling and taking the bus and seek to make modal connections and improvements consistent with land use planning goals - all in an effort to increase overall safety, mobility, and modal choice for residents, businesses, employees & visitors; mitigating traffic congestion and its negative impacts on environment, economy and quality of life.

The final report of this project will result in the development of corridor operational improvements plan conceptualized by the study team in coordination with stakeholders and residents and businesses of these neighborhoods over the past two years in guiding the investment of future funding of transportation improvements along the Long Ridge Road and High Ridge Road corridors through the short, medium, and long-term horizons. Also, the study has established strategies for managing land-use and growth consistent with the vision for each corridor with input from the Land-Use Bureau.


